

AN ACT to provide for the Execution of 1921. certain State Railway Works, and for other purposes. [21 December, 1921.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited for all purposes as "The Railway Works Short title Execution Act, 1921,"

A.D. 1921.

Interpretation.

2 In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires-

"Minister" means the Minister for Railways for the time being.

Minister to cause rolling-stock, &c. to be provided and works to be constructed.

3 It shall be lawful for the Minister to cause to be—

- 1. Purchased, provided, and acquired, any land, locomotives, rolling-stock, and things mentioned in the schedule to this
- n. Undertaken, constructed, improved, executed, completed, and carried out, the various undertakings, works, objects, and purposes mentioned in the schedule to this Act—

at a cost therefor not exceeding in each case the amount for the same set forth in the said schedule.

Cost how to be defrayed.

4 The cost of purchasing, providing, and acquiring such land, locomotives, rolling-stock, and things, and of undertaking, constructing, improving, executing, completing, and carrying out such undertakings, works, objects, and purposes, shall be defrayed as follows:—

1. As to the sum of One hundred and twenty-nine thousand four hundred and seventeen Pounds Nineteen Shillings and Twopence, part thereof, out of moneys raised and received by the Treasurer under "The Loans Act (No. 1), 1921-22": and

II. As to the sum of One hundred thousand Pounds, balance thereof, out of moneys to be provided by Parliament for that purpose.

Devonport Railway Station improvements not to be pro-Public Works Committee.

Proviso.

5 Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act, neither the acquisition of the land, nor the erection of the running sheds and improvements to the railway station at Devonport, comprised in Item ceeded with till 33 in the Schedule to this Act shall be proceeded with or undertaken, reported upon by nor shall any portion of the sum of Ten thousand Pounds, the estimated cost of such acquisition and undertaking, be expended unless and until such acquisition and undertaking have been considered by the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works (hereinafter called "the said Committee") in accordance with the provisions of "The Public Works Committee Act, 1914," and the said Committee have favourably reported on the proposed acquisition and undertaking: Provided, however, that upon the said Committee reporting favourably thereon, the proposed acquisition and undertaking may be proceeded with and the moneys provided therefor may be expended (as and when necessary) without any resolution of Parliament or other authorisation than this Act.

Act retrospective.

6 The provisions of this Act shall have a retrospective operation.
