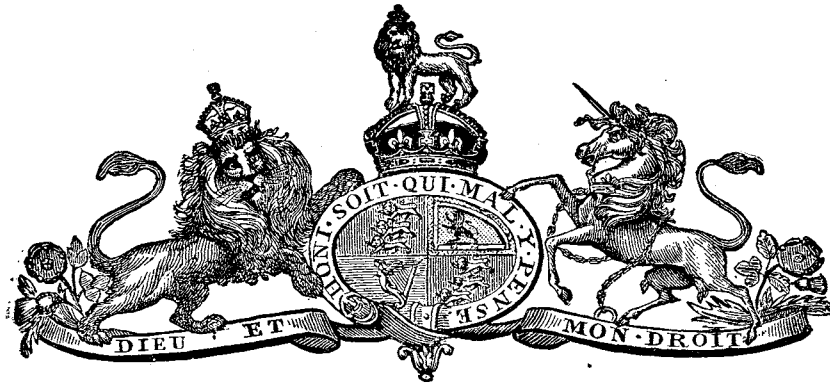

AN ACT to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund a Sum for the Service of the Year ending the Thirtieth day of *June*, One thousand nine hundred and eleven.
1910.
[15 July, 1910.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

- 1 This Act may be cited as “The Supply Act (No. 1), 1910-11.” Short title.
- 2 There shall and may be issued and applied towards making good the supply hereby granted to His Majesty for the service of the year Issue and application of £175,883.

Supply (No. 1).

ending the Thirtieth day of *June*, One thousand nine hundred and eleven, the sum of One hundred and seventy-five thousand eight hundred and eighty-three Pounds out of the Consolidated Revenue, for the purposes and services expressed in the schedule to this Act; and the Treasurer of *Tasmania* is hereby authorised and empowered to issue and apply the moneys authorised to be issued and applied.

Sum available for the purposes set forth in schedule.

3 The said sum shall be available to satisfy the warrants under the hand of the Governor in respect of any purposes and services set forth in the said schedule.

Credit to be given to the Treasurer.

4 The said Treasurer shall be allowed credit in his accounts for any sums of money paid by him in pursuance of any such warrant as aforesaid; and the receipts of the respective persons to whom the same are so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his said accounts for any such sums as are therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly.
