

AN ACT to further amend "The Stock Act." A.D. 1903. [6 January, 1904.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as "The Stock Act, 1903."

Short Title.

2 "The Stock Act, 1896," is hereby repealed.

Repeal 60 Vict. No. 41. Interpretation.

3 In the construction of this Act—

"Tick" shall mean the insect known as tick (Melophagus ovinus).

"Lice" shall mean the insect known as lice (Trichodectes sphærocephalus).

"Infested" shall mean infested with "tick," or "lice."

4—(1.) Every Sheepowner, except where he has obtained a clean Sheep to be certificate as hereinafter provided, shall dip all sheep in his possession dipped. after shearing in every year, and shall also at the same time dip all lambs in his possession.

- (2.) In this Section the expression "after shearing" shall mean any time between the Fourteenth day of July in any year and the First day of March in any succeeding year.
 - (3.) "Dipped" or "dip" means thoroughly immersed in some

effective preparation for destroying tick and lice.

(4.) Any sheepowner who refuses to satisfy the Inspector that the said sheep have been dipped shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Five Pounds nor less than One Pound.

Infested Sheep to be dipped from shearing boards.

5 Any sheepowner who does not hold a certificate stating that his sheep are free from ticks or lice, shall either dip such sheep from the shearing-boards, or such sheep shall be placed in a securely fenced paddock, and be dipped within Twenty-one days after they have been

Sheepowner may obtain clean certificate.

6 Any sheepowner may, on payment of all necessary expenses to be incurred for the purpose, at any time apply to an Inspector for a certificate of cleanliness, and thereupon such sheep shall be examined by an Inspector, who shall, if satisfied that the said sheep are thoroughly clean, grant a certificate of cleanliness in the form in the Schednle (1.) hereto, and upon receiving such certificate it shall not be compulsory for such sheepowner to dip his sheep.

Provided that before such inspection a declaration in the form in Schedule (2.) is made by such sheepowner before a Justice of the Peace that such sheep are not infested, and have not been so for the preceeding

six months.

Owner to notify if Sheep become infested after Certificate granted.

7 The owner of any sheep for which a clean certificate has been given shall forthwith give notice to the Chief Inspector should such sheep at any time become infested, and thereupon such certificate shall become null and void.

Infested sheep found travelling or in Sale Yard. 8 All sheep infested with tick or lice found by any inspector either travelling or in any public sale yard, shall be ordered by such Inspector to be dipped forthwith, and the owner of such sheep shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Five Pounds nor less than One Pound.

Owner to make Return of sheep dipped.

9 Every sheepowner shall, within One month after he has dipped his sheep as aforesaid make a return to the Chief Inspector in the form in Schedule (3.); and any sheepowner neglecting to make such return shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Two Pounds.

Purchaser of certificate that same dipped.

10 Every person selling any sheep shall, if requested by the pursheep may obtain chaser of such sheep, deliver to such purchaser a certificate, in the form in the Schedule (4.), or to the like effect, that such sheep have been dipped in accordance with the provisions of this Act; and it shall not be incumbent upon any person holding such certificate to dip the sheep referred to in such certificate until after the next shearing from

the date of such certificate, unless such sheep shall in the meantime A.D. 1903. become infested.

Any person giving any false certificate under this Section shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five Pounds.

11 Every person who wilfully makes any false declaration or return Penalty for false under this Act shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five Declaration or Pounds.

12 All sums of money appropriated under the provisions of any Act Appropriation of of Parliament for and towards the purposes of "The Stock Act Fund," moneys payable shall be paid and payable in and towards the Consolidated Revenue to Stock Fund. Fund.

13 This Act and "The Stock Act" and every Act amending the Acts to be read same, save as amended by this Act, shall be read and construed together together. as one and the same Act.
