AN ACT supplementary to the Acts for 1916. appropriating certain Sums arising from the Consolidated Revenue Fund to the Service of the State of Tasmania for the Year ended the Thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and sixteen.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as "The Supplementary Appropriation Short title. Act, 1915-16."
