DE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:

2 The sum of Forty thousand nine hundred and sixty-eight Pounds Ten Shillings and Three Pence, which has been issued from the Consolidated Revenue of the State of Tasmania for the service of the year ended the Thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and eighteen, for the several purposes specified in the schedule to this Act shall be deemed to have been appropriated as from the date of the passing of "The Appropriation Act, 1917-18," for the purposes and services expressed in the schedule to this Act.
