AN ACT supplementary to the Acts for 1926. appropriating certain Sums arising from the Consolidated Revenue to the Service of the State of Tasmania for the Year ended the Thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six.

DE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:--

2 The sum of Thirty-four thousand seven hundred and twenty-seven Pounds Sixteen Shillings and Ten Pence, which has been issued from the Consolidated Revenue of the State of Tasmania for the service of the year ended the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, for the several purposes specified in the schedule to this Act shall be deemed to have been appropriated as from the date of the passing of the Appropriation Act, 1925–26, for the purposes and services expressed in the schedule to this Act.
