AN ACT to provide for the Distribution of the Sum of £15,000 reserved by The Constitutional Act for Public Worship in the Colony of Tasmania. [20 October, 1862.]

WHEREAS by The Constitutional Act it is provided that there PREAMBLE. shall be reserved for Public Worship the sum of £15,000, to be appro-priated in the manner set forth in Schedule C. of the said Act, or in such other manner as the Legislature of Van Diemen's Land should thereafter from time to time direct and appoint: And whereas it is expedient to provide for the better distribution of the said sum : Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :-

1 For the purposes of this Act the term "Governing Authority," Interpretation. hereinafter used, shall have the following meanings; that is to say,---

" Governing Authority.

- As to the United Church of England and Ireland, it shall mean the Synod of such Church in this Colony:
- As to the Church of Scotland, it shall mean the Presbytery of such. Church in this Colony for the time being :
- As to the Church of *Rome*, it shall mean the Bishop or other chief Ecclesiastical Authority of such Church in this Colony for the time being :
- As to the Wesleyan Church, it shall mean the District Meeting of such Church in this Colony for the time being :
- As to the Free Church of Scotland, it shall mean the Presbytery of such Church in this Colony for the time being :
- As to the Jewish Church, it shall mean the Governing Body for the time being.

Appropriation of money to persons named in Schedule (1.)

Temporary Supplement to the sum payable to the Church of England.

Temporary Supplement to the sum payable to the Church of Scotland.

Sums to be paid to persons named in Schedule (1), only whilst acting as Ministers in the Colony.

Deprivation or dismissal of per-sons named in Schedule (1.)

Moneys to be applied in aid of Public Worship in the Colony only.

Preceding Section not to apply to Ministers absent on leave.

2 Out of the sum of £15,000 reserved by The Constitutional Act tributing the sum for Public Worship, there shall be annually paid to the Governing Authority of the United Church of England and Ireland the sum of £8770, to the Governing Authority of the Church of Scotland the sum of £1180, to the Governing Authority of the Church of Rome the sum of £3466, to the Governing Authority of the Wesleyan Church the sum of £1100, to the Governing Body of the Free Church of Scotland the sum of £421, and to the Governing Authority of the Jewish Church the sum of £62.

> **3** Subject to the provisions hereinafter contained, the Governing Authority of each such Church shall annually pay to the several persons named in the Schedule (1) who belong to such Church, during their respective lives, the sum or sums set opposite the names of such persons respectively in the said Schedule.

> $\mathbf{4}$ So long as the sum of £8770, hereinbefore provided to be annually paid to the Governing Authority of the Church of England and Ireland, continues to be insufficient to pay to the several persons named in the Schedule (1) who belong to such Church, during their respective lives, the sum or sums of money set opposite the name of each such person in the Schedule (1), there shall from time to time be appropriated by the Governor from the Land Fund of this Colony, and paid to the Governing Authority of such Church, such sum of money in addition to the said sum of £8770 as will suffice to pay the several persons aforesaid the sums aforesaid.

> 5 So long as the sum of $\pounds 1180$, herein provided to be annually paid to the Governing Authority of the Church of Scotland, continues to be insufficient to pay to the several persons named in the Schedule (1) who belong to such Church, during their respective lives, the sum or sums of money set opposite the name of each such person in the Schedule (1), there shall be from time to time appropriated by the Governor out of the Land Fund of this Colony, and paid to the Governing Authority of such Church, such sum of money in addition to the said sum of £1180 as shall suffice to pay to the several persons aforesaid the sums aforesaid.

> 6 The annual sums hereinbefore provided to be paid to the persons named in the Schedule (1) shall be paid to such persons so long only as they respectively continue to act as Ministers of the Church to which they belong within the Colony; and such annual sums shall be paid at such times in each year, and in such proportions, as the Governing Authorities of the respective Churches may appoint.

> 7 Any of the persons named in the Schedule (1) may be deprived of. or dismissed from, office in the same manner as if this Act had not been passed; and, upon any person being so deprived or dismissed, any such person shall cease to have any claim for any payment under the provisions of this Act.

> 8 Subject to the provisions of this Act, the sums payable out of the General Revenue, by virtue hereof, shall be paid and applied in such manner as the Governing Authorities of the said Churches respectively may from time to time direct, for the purposes of Public Worship within this Colony, and not otherwise.

> **9** Nothing in this Act contained shall be deemed or taken to prevent any part of the said sum of £15,000 being paid to any Minister of Religion whilst he may be absent from Tasmania, on leave of absence granted to him, for a period not exceeding Eighteen Months, by the proper authority of the Church to which he belongs.

10 In case any Minister named in the Schedule (1), who is entitled to House allowance an allowance of Sixty Pounds a year for a house, removes to a parish to cease when where there is a Minister's dwelling, the said allowance to such Minister Parsonage is for a house shall thereupon cease.

11 The Colonial Treasurer shall annually pay to the Governing All moneys pay-Authority of each such Church the sum due and payable to such able by Warrant Church by virtue of the provisions of the 2nd Section of this Act; of Governor. and such sums shall be paid upon such days in each year, and in such proportions, as the Governor, by any Warrant under his hand, directs; and the payments so to be made shall be charged upon and payable out of the General Revenue of the Colony of Tasmania.

12 The Governing Authorities of the said respective Churches shall, Annual Return of onnually, in the month of January in each year, file with the Registrar of expenditure of the the Supreme Court a Return setting forth a detailed account of the times sums paid to the several Governing at which, the persons to whom, the purposes for which, and the amounts Bodies. in which, the sum received by such Church has been disposed of; and such Return shall be in the form in the Schedule (2), or to the like effect, and shall contain, as nearly as may be, the several particulars therein set forth, and shall be verified by the Oath of some Officer of such Governing Authority, taken before a Judge or Commissioner of the Supreme Court, or before a Justice of the Peace; and the Governing Authority shall cause such Return to be published in the Gazette; and in case the Governing Authority of any such Church fails to make and file such return in the month of January in any year, then no payment shall be made under the provisions of this Act to the Governing Authority of such Church until such Return has been duly made and filed.

13 The Registrar shall cause an entry and registry of such Returns Mode of filing to be made in a Book, to be kept in his office for that purpose; and such Returns. Book and Returns may be inspected by any person, at reasonable times, upon payment of the sum of Two Shillings for every such inspection.

14 If any person knowingly and wilfully makes a false Oath Penalty for false concerning any of the matters in any such Return specified and set Oath. forth, such person shall be deemed guilty of Perjury, and be liable to the ordinary pains and penalties for such offence.

15 On and after the First day of January, 1863, so much of the Repeal. Acts of Council of the 1st Victoria, No. 16, and the 13th Victoria, No. 1, as authorises the appropriation of any moneys from the Public Revenue, and the Acts of Council of the 2nd Victoria, No. 17, 4th Victoria, No. 16, 5th Victoria, No. 9, and 6th Victoria, No. 15, shall be repealed.

16 Nothing herein contained shall be deemed to deprive any Minister Saves right of named in the Schedule of any right he may have under The Super- Ministers under annuation Act. Act.

17 During the absence from this Colony of the Bishop of the United During Bishop's Church of England and Ireland in Tasmania, or during any vacancy absence, &c., in the See, all the powers and duties conferred or imposed upon the Archdeacon may Bishop of the said Church by the 22 Victoria, No. 20, so far as may be powers, &c. necessary to carry out any of the objects of this Act, shall be exercised and performed by the Senior Archdeacon of the said Church in Tasmania.

18 This Act shall commence and take effect on the First day of Commencement of Act. January in the year 1863.

19 In referring to this Act, it shall be sufficient to use the expression Short title. The State Aid Distribution Act.
