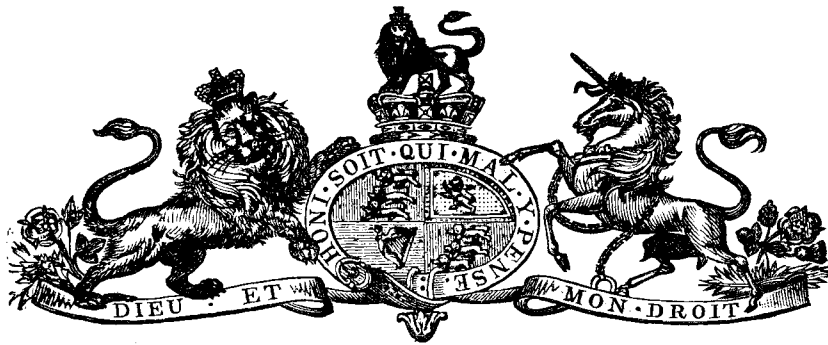

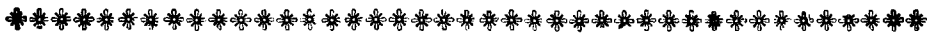

AN ACT to regulate the Size of Cases used A.D. 1890.
in the Sale of Fruit. [28 November, 1890.] —

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

- 1 This Act may be cited as “The Standard Fruit Case Act.” Short title.
- 2 In this Act— Interpretation.
 - “Fruit” shall mean and include Apples, Pears, Apricots, Quinces, and Peaches :
 - “Case” shall mean the Bushel Case established by this Act :
 - “Half-case” shall mean the Half-bushel Case established by this Act.
- 3 The Bushel Case for use in the sale and delivery of Fruit shall be and the same is hereby declared to be a Case which shall contain not less than Two thousand five hundred and forty-eight cubic inches of space. Standard Bushel Case.
- 4 The Half-bushel Case for use in the sale and delivery of Fruit shall be, and the same is hereby declared to be, a Case which shall contain not less than One thousand two hundred and seventy-four cubic inches of space. Standard Half-bushel Case.
- 5 This Act shall not come into operation or take effect until the First day of *January*, 1892.
