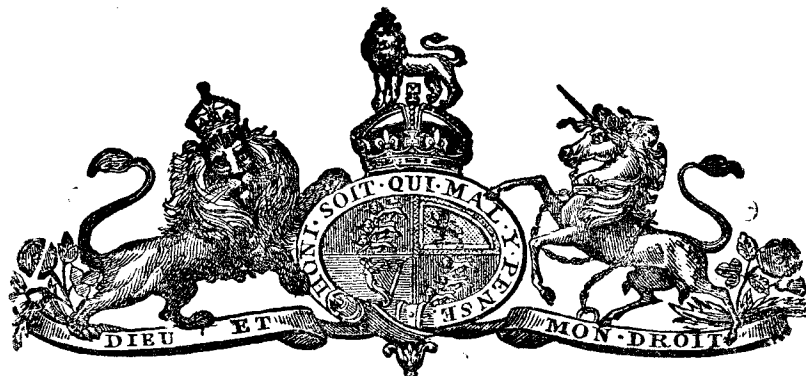

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as “The State Hydro-Electric Works Short title. Execution Act (No. 2), 1923.”

State Hydro-Electric Works Execution (No. 2).

Payments to widow of *Joseph Will* mentioned in Schedule to be in full satisfaction of all claims in respect of his death.

Act retrospective.

2 In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires—

“Minister” means the Minister of the Crown to whom the administration of “The Complex Ores Act, 1909,” and the Acts incorporated therewith is for the time being committed by the Governor.

3—(1) It shall be lawful for the Minister to cause to be undertaken, constructed, executed, completed, and carried out the undertakings, works, objects, and purposes mentioned in the Schedule to this Act at a cost therefor not exceeding in each case the amount for the same set forth in the said Schedule.

(2) All the powers and authorities vested in or exercisable by the Minister under or by virtue of Section Eleven of “The Hydro-Electric Purchase Act, 1914,” or under “The Complex Ores Act, 1909,” and the amendments to such Acts, in relation to the construction, execution, or completion of the Hydro-Electric Works referred to in Section Eleven aforesaid, shall extend and apply to the undertakings, works, objects, and purposes mentioned in Item One of the Schedule to this Act, and the undertaking, constructing, executing, completing, and carrying out thereof.

4 The cost of the undertaking, constructing, executing, completing, and carrying out the undertakings, works, objects, and purposes mentioned in the Schedule to this Act, shall be defrayed out of moneys to be provided by Parliament for that purpose.

5 The payment by the Minister to *Annie Timony Will*, the widow of *Joseph Will* referred to in the said Schedule, of the sum of Two hundred Pounds therein mentioned, together with the sum of Two hundred Pounds heretofore paid by the Minister into the Court of Requests at Hobart, under the the provisions of “The Workers’ Compensation Act, 1918,” in respect of the death of the said *Joseph Will*, shall be in full satisfaction of any claim which the said widow, or any child or dependant of the said *Joseph Will* deceased, or his legal personal representative or any other person might, but for this section, have had against the Crown or the Minister by reason or in consequence of the death of the said *Joseph Will* deceased having been caused by accident arising out of, and in the course of, or while in, his employment in the service of the Crown.

6 The provisions of this Act shall have a retrospective operation.
