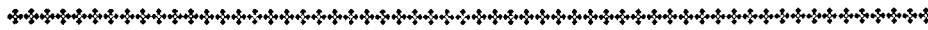

AN ACT to amend the Suppression of Public Betting and Gaming Act, 1896. A.D.  
**1931.**

[14 December, 1931.]

**B**E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

**1** This Act may be cited as “The Suppression of Public Betting and Gaming Act, 1931.” Short title.

**2** Section Thirteen of the Suppression of Public Betting and Gaming Act, 1896, is hereby amended—

I. By inserting the figure “(1)” before the word “The” at the beginning thereof: and

II. By adding at the end thereof the following new Subsections (2) and (3):—

“(2) Regulations under this section may provide for the issue by the Treasurer of a licence, in the prescribed form and subject to the prescribed conditions, to any person, authorising such person to conduct a lottery.

“(3) Such conditions as aforesaid may require the deposit with the Treasurer of a prescribed sum as security for the compliance therewith, and the granting of any such licence shall be in the discretion of the Treasurer.”
