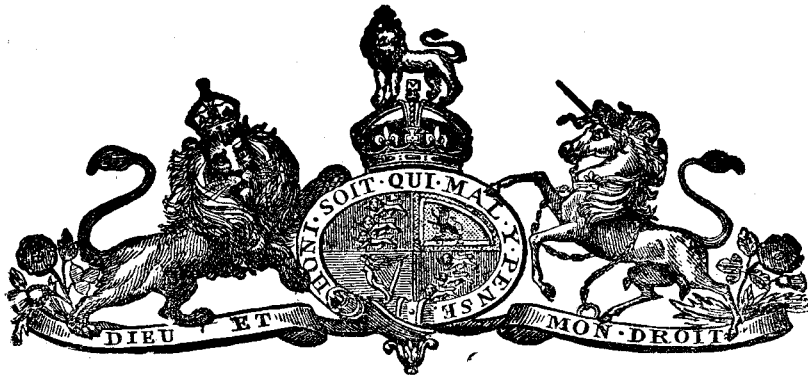

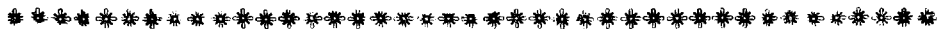

AN ACT to amend "The Scenery Preservation Act, 1915." A.D. 1921.  
[21 December, 1921.]

**BE** it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

- 1 This Act may be cited as "The Scenery Preservation Act, 1921." Short title.
- 2 In this Act—  
" The Principal Act " means " The Scenery Preservation Act, 6 Geo. V. No. 15. 1915." Interpretation.

**3** Section Ten of the Principal Act is hereby repealed and the following new section substituted therefor:—

“**10** It shall be lawful for the Governor on the recommendation of the Board—

i. In the case of Crown land reserved under this Act, by the proclamation declaring the same to be so reserved, or by any subsequent proclamation: or

ii. In the case of private land purchased, acquired, or taken for a reserve for the purposes of this Act, at any time after such taking, purchase, or acquisition, by proclamation—

to declare that such land, or any defined portion thereof, shall be exempt from any specified provisions of this Act, and, on any such recommendation, in the same manner to revoke, wholly or in part, any previous proclamation under this section.”
