

AN ACT to provide for the Purchase of 1920. Steamships for the Tasmanian Government Shipping Department. [20 December, 1920.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as "The State Steamships Purchase Act, Short title and 1920," and shall be deemed to have come into operation on the Tenth commencement, day of May, One thousand nine hundred and twenty.

Interpretation.

2 In this Act-

"Department" means the Tasmanian Government Shipping
Department:

"Minister" means the Chief Secretary for the time being of the State, or other responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being charged with the administration of the Department.

Minister may cause steamships to be purchased or constructed. 3 It shall be lawful for the Minister to cause to be purchased or constructed for the Department steamships, not exceeding Six in number, suitable for the purposes of the Department, at a cost not exceeding in the whole the sum of Five hundred thousand Pounds.

Costs to be defrayed out of moneys to be provided by Parliament.

4 The cost of purchasing or constructing such steamships, as aforesaid, shall be defrayed out of moneys to be provided by Parliament for that purpose.
