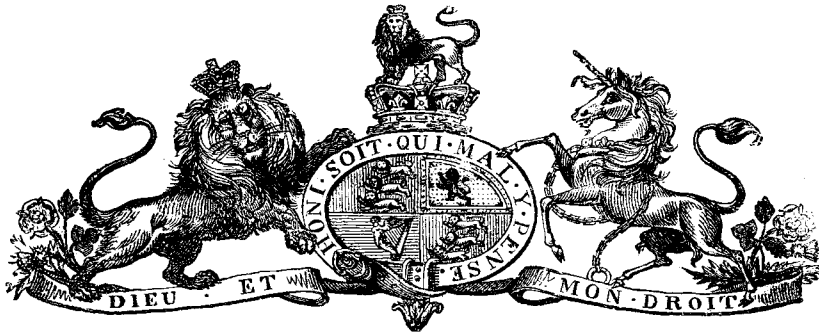

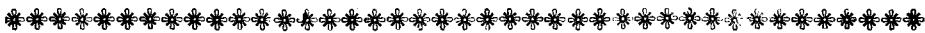

AN ACT to amend "The Tasmanian University Act." [28 November, 1890.] A.D. 1890.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend "The Tasmanian University Act:" PREAMBLE. 53 Vict. No. 41.

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as "The Tasmanian University Amendment Act, 1890." Short title.

2 In this Act "the said Act" shall mean and include "The Tasmanian University Act." Interpretation. 53 Vict. No. 41.

3 Section Two of the said Act is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following shall hereafter be and be deemed to be and may be cited as Section Two of the said Act; that is to say— Substitution for Section 2 of 53 Vict. No. 41.

"The Council shall consist of Eighteen Members, Nine of whom shall be elected by the Senate and Eight of whom shall be elected by the Members of both Houses of Parliament, in such manner as may be provided by Regulations to be made by the Governor in Council; and the Minister of Education shall, ex officio, be a Member of the Council. Council to consist of Eighteen Members.

**4** Section Four of the said Act is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following shall hereafter be and be deemed to be and may be cited as Section Four of the said Act; that is to say—

“(1.) If any Member of the Council shall die, or decline to act, or resign or depart out of *Tasmania* and remain out of *Tasmania* for a period exceeding Six months, or shall absent himself from Six consecutive meetings of the Council, his seat shall thereupon become vacant, and another person shall be elected to fill the vacancy caused as aforesaid.

“(2.) Every extraordinary vacancy among the Members of the Council elected by the Members of both Houses of Parliament shall be filled up by an election as follows:—The first extraordinary vacancy shall be filled up by the Members of the House of Assembly, and the next by the Members of the Legislative Council, and so on alternately as any such extraordinary vacancy shall occur; and every other extraordinary vacancy shall be filled up by an election by the Senate.

“(3.) Every Member of the Council elected to fill any extraordinary vacancy in the Council shall hold office for the residue of the period for which his predecessor was elected.”

**5** The word “Ninety” is hereby expunged from the Fourth line of the Twentieth Section of the said Act, and the word “Ninety-one” is inserted in lieu thereof.

**6** This Act and the said Act, save as amended by this Act, shall be read and construed together as one Act.
