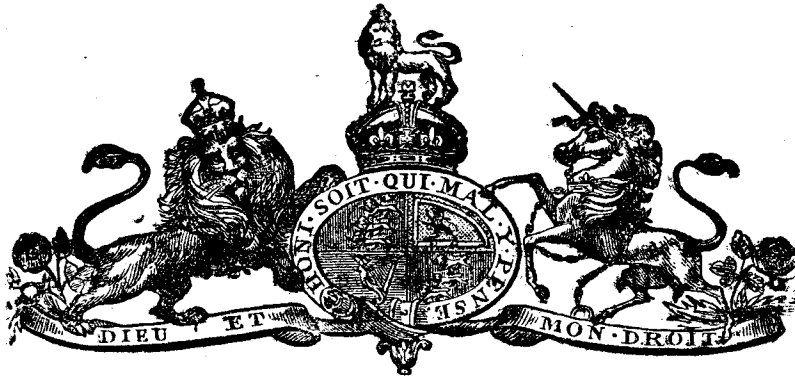

AN ACT to amend an Act, intituled "An Act 1908.
to vest in the University of *Tasmania* the
Property known as the High School of
Hobart." [14 *December*, 1908.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

1 This Act may be cited as "The University Property Amendment Short title, Act, 1908."

University Property Amendment.

2 The Act intituled "An Act to vest in the University of *Tasmania* the Property known as the High School of *Hobart*" may be cited as "The University Property Act," and is hereinafter referred to as the Principal Act.

3 The piece of land described in the First Schedule hereto is hereby vested in the University of *Tasmania*, and shall be deemed to have been vested in that University, under Section One of the Principal Act, as from the commencement of that Act, in lieu of the piece of land described in the schedule to the Principal Act, which last-mentioned schedule is hereby repealed.

Empowering
University to sell
certain land.

4 Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the Principal Act, the University of *Tasmania* is hereby empowered—

i. To sell by private contract to His Majesty the King, for the price or sum of One thousand five hundred Pounds, all that piece of land containing One acre, situate at the angle of *Park* and *Edward* streets, in the city of *Hobart*, in *Tasmania*, and described in the Second Schedule hereto, the same being part of the piece of land described in the First Schedule hereto: and

ii. To surrender and convey to His Majesty the King the said One acre of land, and to execute any deed necessary for the purpose.

5 The said sum of One thousand five hundred Pounds, together with any accruing income thereof, shall be expended and applied by the Council of the said University, as and when the Council thinks fit, for building purposes upon the land remaining vested in the said University by virtue of the Principal Act and this Act.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

CITY OF HOBART.4A. 3R. 1 $\frac{8}{10}$ P.

Bounded on the north-west by 6 chains and $\frac{8}{10}$ of a link north-easterly along *Edward-street* commencing at the angle of that street with *Park-street* on the north-east by 7 chains and 96 links south-easterly in two bearings along the *Queen's Domain* on the south-east by 5 chains 96 $\frac{8}{10}$ links south-westerly in two bearings also along that land and thence on the south-west by 7 chains 96 $\frac{1}{2}$ links north-westerly in several bearings along *Park-street* aforesaid to the point of commencement.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

All that one acre of land situate at the angle of Park and Edward streets in the City of Hobart in Tasmania. Bounded on the north-west by 4 chains $36\frac{3}{8}$ links north-easterly along Edward-street commencing at the angle of that street with Park-street on the north-east by 2 chains $35\frac{3}{8}$ links south-easterly along portion of 4a. 2r. 25p. of land granted to Thomas Daniel Chapman, Henry Hopkins, Robert Officer, Alexander McNaughton, William Robertson and William Rout on the south east by 4 chains $13\frac{1}{8}$ links south-westerly along other portion of that land to Park-street aforesaid and thence on the south-west by 2 chains $36\frac{1}{2}$ links north-westerly in 2 bearings along that street to the point of commencement.
