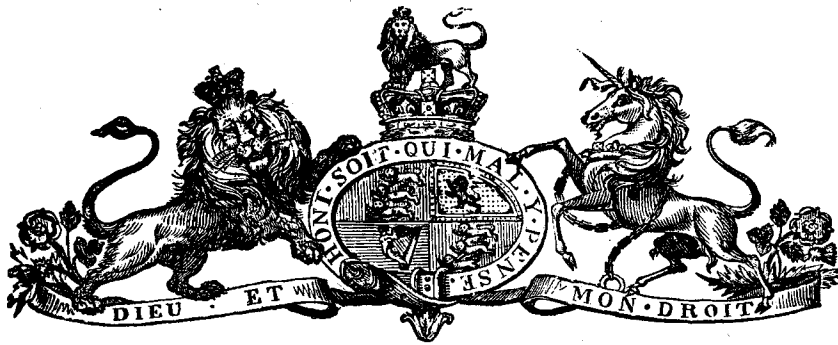

AN ACT to further amend *The Waste Lands Act.*  
[27 December, 1872.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to further amend *The Waste Lands Act*:  
Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*,  
by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and  
House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

PREAMBLE.  
34 Vict. No. 10.

**1** Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in *The Waste Lands Act*, it shall be lawful for the Commissioner to offer for sale by auction, and to sell, any Pastoral Waste Lands of the Crown held by any person for "Quiet Enjoyment" under the Regulations for the Disposal of the Waste Lands of the Crown dated the First day of *November*, 1851, and published in the *Gazette* on the Fourth day of the same month, although such lands or any of them have not previously to any sale by auction been surveyed and delineated in the public charts of the Colony, in such lots as are subsequently offered and put up for sale, in manner directed by the Thirty-second Section of the said Act; and all the provisions of the said Act, save so far as is herein otherwise provided, shall be applicable to the sale and disposal of any lands hereinbefore mentioned.

"Quiet Enjoyment" pastoral lands may be sold before survey.

**2** This Act and *The Waste Lands Act*, and any Act altering or amending the same, shall, save so far as altered or amended by this Act, be read and construed together as one Act.

Acts to be read together.

**3** This Act may be cited as "The Waste Lands Act, 1872."
