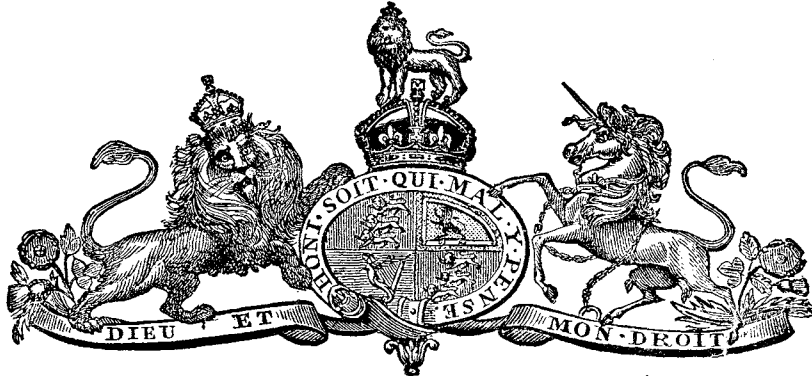

AN ACT to amend the Wynyard Lighting Act, 1914. [19 December, 1927.]

A.D. 1927.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

| <p><b>1</b>—(1) This Act may be cited as “The Wynyard Lighting Act, 1927.”</p> <p>(2) The Wynyard Lighting Act, 1914, is herein called “the Principal Act.”</p> <p><b>2</b> The powers of the Council under this Act shall be in addition to, and not in substitution for, the powers conferred on the Council under the Principal Act.</p> <p><b>3</b> It shall be lawful for the Council from time to time to enter into an agreement with the Minister, or other authority for the time being administering the affairs of the Hydro-Electric Department of the State, for the purchase by the</p> | <p>Short title.</p> <p>Principal Act,<br/>5 Geo. *Wynyard Lighting.*

- A.D. 1927. — Council from such Minister or other authority as aforesaid, for the purposes of the Principal Act as hereby amended, of electricity in such quantities, and upon such terms and conditions in all respects as shall be mutually agreed upon between the parties to such agreement.
- Power to borrow £7500. 4 In addition to any sum or sums previously borrowed, or authorised to be borrowed by or on behalf of the Council under the authority of any Act, it shall be lawful for the Council to raise by way of loan, under the provisions and for the purposes set out in the Principal Act as hereby amended, any sum or sums not exceeding in the whole the sum of Seven thousand five hundred Pounds, under the State Loans to Local Bodies Act, 1921, and all moneys so borrowed shall be deemed to have been borrowed upon the security of all the revenues of the Council.
- 12 Geo.V. No. 23. Sinking Fund. 5 The amount payable by the Council as an annual contribution towards a sinking fund in respect of any moneys borrowed under the State Loans to Local Bodies Act, as authorised by this Act, shall be a sum equal to Two Pounds per centum per annum on the moneys so borrowed.
- No poll necessary. 6 Notwithstanding the provisions of the Principal Act, or of any other Act, it shall not be necessary for the Council to take any poll before proceeding to exercise any of the authorities or powers conferred on the Council by this Act.
- Amendment of Section 45 of Principal Act. 5 Geo. V. No. 37. 7 Section Forty-five of the Principal Act is hereby amended by deleting the word "Sixpence" from line six thereof and substituting the words "One Shilling" in lieu thereof.
- Power to levy light rate. 14 Geo.V. No. 61. 8 In addition to the powers provided in Section **141k** of the Local Government Act, 1924, it shall be lawful for the Council once or oftener in every year to make and levy a light rate or light rates upon all properties within any power area which may from time to time be defined under the provisions of Section **141d** of that Act for the purposes of the Principal Act as hereby amended on the assessed annual value of such properties as shown by the assessment roll: Provided that such rate shall not in any one year exceed the sum of One Shilling in the Pound on the assessed annual value of the properties so rated.
- Treasurer authorised to raise £7500. 9 It shall be lawful for the Treasurer to borrow, raise, and receive a total sum not exceeding Seven thousand five hundred Pounds for the purposes of this Act.
