

AN ACT to determine the Conditions of 1907. the Grant-in-aid of Three thousand Pounds to the Zeehan-Western, Limited, authorised by "The Surplus Revenue Act, 1907," and for other purposes.

[14 November, 1907.]

BE it enacted by his Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as "The Zeehan-Western, Limited, Deep-Short title and Sinking Encouragement Act, 1907," and shall be read with "The incorporation. Surplus Revenue Act, 1907," hereinafter referred to as "the said Act." 7 Ed. VII. No. 2. 4d.]

Zeehan-Western, Limited, Deep-sinking.

Interpretation.

2 In this Act, and any Regulations made thereunder, unless the context otherwise determines-

"Company" means The Zeehan-Western Limited:

"Mine" has the meaning assigned to it (as a noun) by Section Four of "The Mining Act, 1905":

"Minister" means the Responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering "The Mining Act, 1905"

"Treasurer" means the Treasurer for the time being of the State.

Conditions of Aid.

3 The Grant-in-aid of Three thousand Pounds authorised by the said Act to be paid to the company shall be payable on the following conditions:---

> 1. The company shall make application for the said grant-inaid, and such application shall be in such form and contain such particulars as the Minister directs, and be subject to his approval.

ir. No payment shall be made on account of the said grant-inaid until the company has entered into an agreement with the Minister, approved of by the Governor, and embodying the terms and conditions prescribed by this Act, and such other terms and conditions, not being inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, as the Governor thinks proper.

III. No payment shall be made on account of the said Grant-inaid except in the proportion of One Pound for every One Pound expended by the company to the satisfaction of the Minister in—

> (a) Sinking the existing main shaft below the present depth of Eight hundred feet vertically from the natural surface of their mine.

> (b) Opening up and exploring the lodes below the said depth or Eight hundred feet, and in otherwise prospecting and developing the mine below that depth.

iv. The said expenditure by the company under the preceding paragraph, shall be subject to the approval of the Minister and may be in respect of-

(a) Labor or work done whether upon wages or by contract; and

(b) Any necessary stores such as explosives, candles, and other requisites for mining; timber for securing any work; pumps and any necessary material used for pumping or raising water; ropes, cages, or other materials required for the safe conduct of the work; and

(c) Such proportion, as the Minister deems reasonable and proper, of the cost of supervision, upkeep of the engines used for pumping and winding, fuel, boiler maintenance, and of the wages of engine-

drivers and stokers.

Zeehan-Western, Limited, Deep-sinking.

4 All moneys paid to the company on account of the said Grant- A.D. 1907. in-aid of Three thousand Pounds, shall be and are hereby until repayment thereof charged upon the company's mine and property, to be a charge on and no profits shall be taken by the company, or paid away by the mine and property company at any time to its shareholders, until all moneys paid to the of Company. company in respect of the said sum of Three thousand Pounds shall have been paid to the Treasurer, and the company shall comply with the terms of this Section, and the Treasurer may take any proceedings at law or in equity to compel compliance herewith.

5 The Governor may from time to time make Regulations for Regulations. carrying into effect the purposes of this Act.
