**1**—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Public Works Committee Act (No. 2) 1962.*

(2) The *Public Works Committee Act 1914*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

**2** Section sixteen of the Principal Act is amended—

(a) by omitting from subsection (1) thereof the words “sanctioned as in this section provided” and substituting therefor the words “it has first been referred to and reported upon by the Committee in accordance with this section”; and

(b) by omitting subsection (5) thereof.

**3** Section eighteen of the Principal Act is repealed.

**4** Section thirty-two of the Principal Act is repealed and the following section is substituted therefor:—

Remuneration  
of members  
of the  
Committee.

“32—(1) Members of the Committee are entitled to be paid such remuneration, calculated at such rates and in such manner, and subject to such provisions, as may be determined by the Tribunal established under the *Parliamentary Salaries and Allowances Act 1962.*

(2) Until otherwise determined by the Tribunal referred to in subsection (1) of this section, the members of the Committee shall each receive, by way of remuneration for their services as members thereof, a fee for each day on which they attend at a summoned meeting of the Committee at which a quorum is present, and for each day while they are travelling to or from such a meeting, according to the following scale:—

(a) The Chairman, Vice-Chairman, or other member presiding at a meeting, four pounds ten shillings for each day; and

(b) Every other member, three pounds ten shillings for each day.”

## WATERWORKS CLAUSES.

---

No. 59 of 1962.

AN ACT to amend the *Waterworks Clauses Act 1952.* [11 December 1962.]

**B**E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

**1**—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Waterworks Clauses Act 1962.*

(2) The *Waterworks Clauses Act 1952*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

**2** Section thirty-three of the Principal Act is amended by omitting subsection (1) and substituting therefor the following subsection:—

Undertakers to affix fire-plugs in mains.

“(1) The undertakers may, and at the request—

(a) in a fire district of the fire brigade board and at the undertaker’s expense; and

(b) elsewhere of the council and at its expense,

shall, fix proper fire-plugs in the main and other pipes belonging to them, or erect and connect therewith pillar hydrants and stand pipes, at such places as may be most proper and convenient for the supply of water for extinguishing any fire which may break out within the limits of the special Act.”.

**3** Section thirty-five of the Principal Act is repealed.

## SUNDAY OBSERVANCE.

---

### No. 60 of 1962.

AN ACT to amend the *Sunday Observance Act 1908*.  
[11 December 1962.]

**BE** it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

**1**—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Sunday Observance Act 1962*.

Short title and citation.

(2) The *Sunday Observance Act 1908*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

**2** Section eleven of the Principal Act is amended—

(a) by inserting after paragraph X of subsection (1) thereof the following paragraph:—

Works of necessity or mercy not prohibited.

“XA The delivery for sale, and the sale, subject to the provisions of the *Shops Act 1925*, between the hours of nine o’clock in the forenoon and nine o’clock in the afternoon of—

(a) any newspaper or edition of a newspaper that is printed for the purpose of publication or sale on Sundays: and
