AN ACT further to amend "The Transfer of Land Act, 1874."

[Assented to, 3rd September, 1879.]

WHEREAS it is expedient further to amend "The Transfer of Land Act, 1874," and "The Transfer of Land Act, 1874, Amendment Act, 1878": Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1 SECTION 2 of "The Transfer of Land Act, 1874, Amendment Act, 1878," shall be and the same is hereby amended by inserting between the words "duplicate thereof" and "and shall have been signed," in the latter part of such section, the words "if any."

Transfer of Land Acts—Amendment.

Advertisement of application in *Government Gazette*.

Cost of advertisement to be paid in advance to the Registrar.

Cases where land shall be resumed or taken.

2 NOTWITHSTANDING the provisions contained in the 18th and 19th sections of "The Transfer of Land Act, 1874," the Commissioner of Titles may direct notice of any application to be advertised as directed by the said 19th section; and every application advertised shall be advertised once at least in the *Government Gazette*, in addition to the newspaper mentioned in the 19th section of the said Act. And the cost and charges of such advertisement shall in all cases be paid to the Registrar before the publication thereof.

3 IN all cases where land shall be resumed or taken by virtue of the resumption clauses of Deeds of Grant, or of "The Railways Act, 1878," such resumption or taking shall be entered on the folium of the Register Book containing an entry of title to the land out of which such taking or resumption shall have been made; and the Commissioner may require evidence of such resumption or taking having been effected, to be produced for his satisfaction.
